A Clubmark workshop is planned for 1st December 2009. It is aimed at Clubs who are part way through the Clubmark process or who are required to go through re-accreditation. The workshop will also be of help to clubs who are considering going through Clubmark. The most effective way for a Club to be successful is to complete the Clubmark Evidence File during the Close Season in order that a site visit can be carried out in the early part of the Summer. In addition to providing support to clubs going through the process, there will be an opportunity to ask questions & share answers in a practical way.
